Strengthening Vietnam-China connectivity through aviation and financial cooperation



From April 14-17, 2026, a delegation from Sovico, Vietjet, HDBank, Vikki Digital Bank, and Phu Long, led by Chairwoman Dr. Nguyen Thi Phuong Thao, engaged in strategic meetings with leading Chinese corporations. These activities took place within the framework of the State visit of General Secretary and President To Lam and his spouse to China, at the invitation of General Secretary and President Xi Jinping.

At the Investment Cooperation Conference in Beijing, Vietjet announced five new routes connecting Vietnam and China: Hanoi-Hangzhou, Hanoi-Enshi, Hanoi-Huangshan, Ho Chi Minh City-Guilin, and Ho Chi Minh City-Huangshan.

Vietjet also signed a financing agreement with SPDB Financial Leasing (SPDBFL), representing Shanghai Pudong Development Bank, for the lease of 10 Comac C909 aircraft, further strengthening aviation-finance cooperation.

In addition, Vietjet and AVIC Cabin Systems signed a comprehensive cooperation agreement in aircraft interiors and supporting industries, marking a new phase of strategic collaboration amid growing Vietnam-China industrial and technological ties.

Airbus leaders pledge to work with Vietjet to develop aviation infrastructure



On April 22, at the Victoria Aviation Academy, Chairwoman - Dr. Nguyen Thi Phuong Thao welcomed the Member of the Central Committee of the Party, Vice Chairman of the People's Committee of Ho Chi Minh City, Nguyen Manh Cuong and Mr. Benoit de Saint-Exupéry - Senior Vice President, Chief Commercial Officer of Airbus Group visiting and working with Vietjet.

Speaking at the event, Chairwoman Dr. Nguyen Thi Phuong Thao welcomed the delegation from Ho Chi Minh City and Airbus, affirming the significance of more than 15 years of strong cooperation between Vietjet and Airbus, and proposing to continue expanding cooperation with Airbus in many fields, especially the comprehensive upgrading of Ho Chi Minh City's aviation infrastructure.

Meeting with the Embassy of France to promote international cooperation



On April 6, Chairwoman Dr. Nguyen Thi Phuong Thao held a reception and working session with Olivier Brochet, Ambassador of France to Vietnam. Ambassador Olivier Brochet congratulated the group and its subsidiaries on their impressive development achievements, while highly appreciating their role in international connectivity and cooperation with French partners, particularly the strategic partnership between Vietjet and Airbus. He expressed his hope to further promote cooperation in the coming period and wished for Vietjet to soon open direct flights to France, thereby enhancing connectivity and fostering economic, cultural, and trade development between the two countries.

Vietjet consolidates its senior leadership team

Vietjet has strengthened its senior leadership team to implement the 2025-2030 development strategy, aiming to become a modern, sustainable multinational aviation group in the global market.

For the 2022-2027 term, the Board of Directors comprises Madame Nguyen Thi Phuong Thao as Chairwoman, Mr. Dinh Viet Phuong as First Vice Chairman, and Vice Chairpersons Mr. Philipp Rösler, Madame Ho Ngoc Yen Phuong, Mr. Khuat Viet Hung, Mr. Nguyen Anh Tuan, and Madame Nguyen Thanh Ha. Mr. Nguyen Thanh Son, Member of the Board of Directors, has been appointed Chief Executive Officer, succeeding Mr. Dinh Viet Phuong.

AVIATION NEWS

* The Ministry of Construction has submitted to the Prime Minister a proposal to adjust the national airport system plan for 2021-2030, with a vision to 2050, including new airports in Mang Den and Van Phong, and upgrading Quang Tri Airport from 4C to 4E.

* During the Reunification Day-May 1 holiday period, major airports such as Tan Son Nhat and Noi Bai recorded a surge in passenger traffic, particularly among international travelers.

* The Civil Aviation Authority of Vietnam recommends continuing tax incentives and reducing service fees to ease cost pressures on the aviation sector.

* Airlines are adding more international routes to China, Japan, Southeast Asia, and Europe to meet rising demand in summer 2026.

Vietjet 2026 Annual General Meeting: Outstanding 2025 Results. 30% Dividend Payout. Boosting International Network Expansion - Attracting Global Investment



Vietjet Aviation Joint Stock Company (HOSE: VJC) successfully held its 2026 Annual General Meeting of Shareholders (AGM), embarking on a new development phase with a global vision, sustainable growth, and long-term value for shareholders.

Outstanding Achievements

In 2025, Vietjet recorded positive business results, exceeding the set targets:

- Operated 135 aircraft, including 107 based in Vietnam, serving 254 routes.
- Transported 28.2 million passengers across more than 153,000 flights.
- Consolidated revenue: VND 82.093 trillion (approx. US\$3.11 billion).
- Profit after tax: VND 2.123 trillion (approx. US\$80.58 million) (+51.2%, reaching 120% of the target).
- Direct and indirect tax and fee payment: VND 10.537 trillion (approx. US\$399.96 million).
- Placed orders for 100 A321neo aircraft plus 50 purchase options with Airbus.
- Ordered 20 Airbus A330neo wide-body aircraft, placing Vietjet among the airlines with the largest aircraft orders in the world.

Global Strategy - Scaling Up and Elevating the Ecosystem

Entering 2026, Vietjet remains steadfast in its strategy: "Fly the world - Reach new heights," which is centered on these pillars:

- Expanding the international flight network, targeting key markets such as Europe and the United States.
- Developing a modern fleet of Airbus A321neo, A330neo, Boeing 737-8, and strategic partnerships with Rolls-Royce, CFM, and Pratt & Whitney.
- Pioneering the establishment of the International Aviation Finance Center in collaboration with the Vietnam International Financial Center in Ho Chi Minh City.
- Investing in a wide-body fleet and Business class cabins which are highly appreciated by customers especially on long-haul routes.

Investing for the Future - Optimizing Operations, Increasing Efficiency

Apart from growth, Vietjet also focuses on building a long-term foundation:

- Investing in the Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) Center at Long Thanh.
- Carrying out ground self-handling services at the country's two largest airports, Noi Bai and Tan Son Nhat, optimizing operational costs.
- Developing the Vietjet Aviation Academy (VJAA) - proactively securing high-quality human resources. In 2025, it organized 15,198 courses for 162,100 trainees, an increase of 53% and 30% respectively compared to 2024.
- Diversifying ancillary products and services to increase revenue.
- Engaging in financial and technological cooperation with global partners.

Increasing Shareholder Value - A Long-term Vision

The General Meeting approved:

- A 30% dividend payout in shares.
- The election of two new, highly experienced Board members. Vietjet continues its commitment to growth coupled with efficiency, expansion paired with financial discipline, and development tied to sustainable value for shareholders.

Message from the Chairwoman of the Board

Speaking at the meeting, Vietjet Chairwoman - Dr. Nguyen Thi Phuong Thao shared: "Vietjet does not just transport passengers - we connect economies, dreams, and futures. Vietjet's vision is a vision for decades. When shareholders place their trust in us, we commit to delivering value not just through today's results, but through a future of sustainable, disciplined growth and abundant opportunities. The more the world opens up, the further Vietjet flies."

Vietjet records strong growth through operational optimization and international flight network expansion in Q1/2026



Positive Business Growth

According to the Q1/2026 financial report, Vietjet achieved:

- Consolidated revenue: VND 21.021 trillion (approx. US\$798.6 million) (up 17.1% YOY).
- Consolidated profit before tax: VND 1.142 trillion (approx. US\$43.3 million) (up 36.5% YOY).
- Consolidated profit after tax: VND 1.023 trillion (approx. US\$38.8 million) (remarkably up 59.6% YOY).

Vietjet's parent company achieved:

- Revenue: VND 19.473 trillion (approx. US\$740.5 million) (up 8.7% YOY).
- Profit before tax: VND 1.020 trillion (approx. US\$38.7 million) (up 24.5% YOY).
- Profit after tax: VND 922 billion (approx. US\$35 million) (up 47% YOY).

Revenue and profit witnessed strong growth as Vietjet enhanced operational cost control by optimizing operating performance, promoting digital transformation, and building a new and modern fleet to save fuel, contributing to business efficiency.

Strong Financial Foundation

As of March 31, 2026:

- Vietjet's total assets: VND 143.534 trillion (approx. US\$5.45 billion).
- Net debt/equity ratio: 2.1.
- Liquidity ratio: 1.5.

Financial indicators were maintained within the industry's safety threshold as Vietjet continued investing in new aircraft.

In Q1 2026, the airline's direct and indirect contributions to the State budget totaled VND 1.941 trillion (approximately US\$73.7 million).

Investment in Fleet, Infrastructure, and Human Resources

In Q1/2026, Vietjet heavily invested in its future fleet:

- A deal of Pratt & Whitney GTF engines for 44 Airbus A325neo aircraft, which was approximately worth of US\$5.4 billion.
- An aircraft financing agreement approximately worth of US\$965 million for 6 Boeing 737-8 aircraft.
- A finance lease agreement for 10 Comac C909 aircraft.

In the meantime, the airline continued to expand with a long-term vision:

- Serving as a founding member of the Asia-Pacific Aviation Finance Hub.
- Signed an agreement with AVIC Cabin Systems to cooperate in developing modern aircraft interior solutions, aiming to build a sustainable aviation supporting industrial ecosystem in Vietnam.
- Pioneered the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and fuel optimization solutions through strategic partnerships with international partners such as Open Airlines and Safran.
- Invested in human resources through the Vietjet Aviation Academy (VJAA): organizing 3,193 courses and training 34,727 trainees in the first three months of the year; continued to sign training agreements with Australia Aviation and F Air Flight School.

- World's Best Ultra Low-Cost Carrier 2026 and Top 10 Airport Airlines in 2026 awarded by AirlineRatings.
- Global Best Place To Work in 2026 at the World HRD Congress & Awards 2026.
- The lowest-emission airline on intra-Southeast Asian routes, according to Cirium's Flight Emissions Review 2025.

In addition to the Government's support regarding policies to reduce value-added tax (VAT), import-export tax, environmental protection tax, and special consumption tax on aviation fuel in response to the impact of the conflict in the Middle East, Vietjet looks forward to further flexible pricing policies on domestic routes.

- Long-term growth momentum.

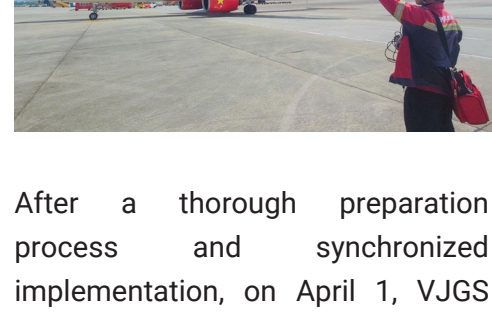

The Civil Aviation Authority of Vietnam extends AOC for Vietjet



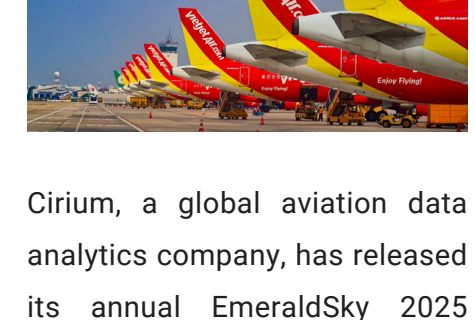
Following a comprehensive review conducted from April 8, 2026 to April 15, 2026, the Civil Aviation Authority of Vietnam officially extended Vietjet's Air Operator Certificate (AOC). Vietjet's Air Operator Certificate (AOC) Standing Director Nguyen Thanh Son, Standing Vice President To Viet Thang, Group Director of Flight Operations Nguyen Thai Trung, representatives from various departments, specialized divisions, and related units exchanged views with the CAAV delegation during the final meeting of the evaluation process.

VJGS officially takes over aircraft headset communication duty



After a thorough preparation process and synchronized implementation, on April 1, VJGS officially assumed responsibility for aircraft headset communication, in close coordination with AMO and GO, under the supervision and evaluation of SQA. Standing Vice President of Vietjet, Chairman of VJGS To Viet Thang, and CEO of VJGS Pham Le Viet and Vice President of VJGS Tran Quang Hoa inspected, reviewed operations, and encouraged the staff on the first day of implementation. This transfer contributes to optimizing service procedures, thereby continuing to bring a higher-quality flying experience to passengers.

Vietjet leads Southeast Asia in emissions efficiency



Cirium, a global aviation data analytics company, has released its annual EmeraldSky 2025 report, ranking the world's 100 largest airlines by CO₂/ASK (carbon emissions per available seat kilometer). Notably, Vietjet leads Southeast Asia in emissions efficiency, recording 64.5g CO₂/ASK, and is recognized as the most emissions-efficient airline on regional routes. The regional top three include Vietjet, Singapore Airlines, and Lion Air.

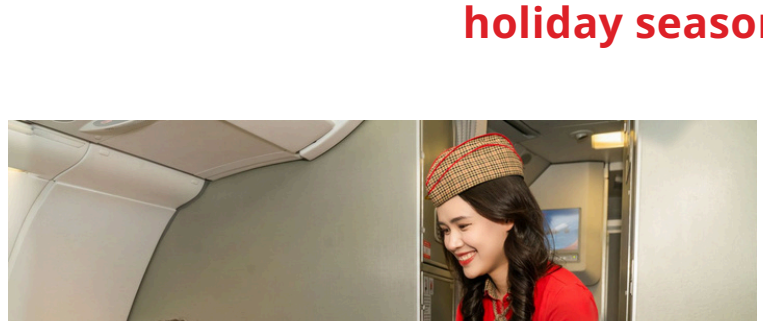
COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES

Vietjet operates nearly 3,800 flights to serve the peak holiday season of April 30 - May 1



In response to the rising travel demand during the King's Commemoration Day and the April 30 - May 1 holiday, Vietjet is increasing flight frequencies across its domestic network, offering nearly 3,800 flights from April 25 to May 5, 2026 to serve passengers traveling for tourism and family visits. The total number of seats offered during the April 30 - May 1 peak period has reached 832,000, an increase of 130,000 seats, or 18% YoY.

Vietjet launches direct flight from Hanoi to Shizuoka



On April 29, Shizuoka Airport in Japan was bustling with activity as Vietjet welcomed the first flight between Shizuoka and Hanoi, the first direct route connecting two prominent destinations in Vietnam and Japan. Governor of Shizuoka Prefecture - Mr. Suzuki Yasutomo, Ambassador of Vietnam to Japan - Mr. Pham Quang Hieu, and leaders of Shizuoka Airport, along with Vietjet representatives, congratulated the new route and welcomed the first passengers on their journey with Vietjet.
